As preparation for work in horticulture, students get hands-on training in TCC's Horticulture laboratory, Design CAD Lab, and three campus greenhouses where they learn to grow floriculture crops and create professional landscape designs. You'll also have the opportunity to gain industry certifications through your course work, including Private, Registered, and/or Commercial Pesticide License with the Virginia Department of Agriculture & Consumer Services (VDACS), Certified Fertilizer Applicator License with VDACS, and ISA Certified Arborist exam preparation.
